

BOSTON REED COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Policy: The Boston Reed College (BRC) Scholarship Program has been established to provide scholarship awards to assist participants with the expenses of completing programs in the Allied Health Field.

Procedure:

- ❖ Interested students must complete official BRC scholarship application.
- ❖ Applications must be postmarked by designated, quarterly deadline and include a synopsis of why applicant should be awarded a scholarship along with two letters of recommendation.
- ❖ The scholarship committee may grant or request personal interviews.
- ❖ Each scholarship will have a value of the total course fee, including textbooks. This does not include related expenses such as uniform or transportation costs.
- ❖ Three scholarships will be awarded quarterly for a total of twelve scholarships annually.
- ❖ Boston Reed College may terminate a scholarship at any time if recipient has failed to comply with program requirements stated in the student handbook.
- ❖ Successful candidates will be notified by mail within 30 days of application deadline.
- ❖ The scholarship and recipients may be referred to in promotions for the Scholarship Program or Boston Reed College.
- ❖ Scholarships are non-transferable and expire one year after date awarded
- ❖ Submissions are only good for submission period.
- ❖ Candidates who are not chosen may resubmit for a future quarter.
- ❖ Applications will be destroyed each quarter.
- ❖ Application due dates: January 1, April 1, July 1, October 1

- ❖ Eligibility criteria
 - Applications from all students, new and returning, are accepted.
 - Applicant must be able to fulfill requirements for successful program completion, ie. possession of high school diploma or equivalent and passing of proficiency tests.

- ❖ Selection criteria
 - Complete application
 - Letters of reference from employer, instructor, or other (non-related) persons
 - Letter from candidate stating why he/she should be awarded: appearance, grammar, spelling, and punctuation will be evaluated.
 - Financial need
 - Content and quality of personal letter
